Lyndsey has held multiple positions with the Stroke Network, beginning as the Regional Stroke Education Coordinator (2014 & 2016) and most recently as the Regional Rehabilitation Coordinator since 2017. Within these positions, Lyndsey has worked diligently with many partners to support stroke system quality improvement. Some of her many and notable accomplishments have included:

- Providing SWOSN support and leadership to the extremely successful Early Supported Discharge (ESD) Pilot in Stratford. Results included:
  - Improved functional improvement for ESD patients
  - o 10-day length of stay savings in inpatient rehab
  - Extremely positive patient/provider feedback
- Development and implementation of a regional education work plan to support realignment and consolidation of stroke services across the South West LHIN to direct care from 28 hospitals to 7 stroke centres.
- Led the final stages in development of the Acute Stroke Unit Orientation as well as co-led the development of the Rehab Stroke Unit Orientation, both of which are now supporting best practices across the province and country.

In addition to her stroke rehabilitation expertise and strong quality improvement focus, Lyndsey is an exceptional team player who focuses on supporting her colleagues at stroke centres and within the regional team. Because of this, the SWOSN team will not only miss her great contributions, but also her friendship and positive influence in the office.    This work is currently being considered for ongoing sustainability funding. If supported, this would ensure that the entire best practice stroke journey is fully operationalized in the Huron Perth stroke district with an integrated funding model including: Integrated inpatient care, Early Supported Discharge care for 14 days and Community Stroke Rehabilitation Team care for 12 weeks
- Developing Stratford General Hospital's successful Peer Visiting Program for Stroke Survivors

In addition to strong leadership and change management skills, Bonnie is an exceptional team player, creating high functioning teams and greatly supporting SWOSN's ability to influence change and improvement across our geography and the province. Also of great importance and benefit to her colleagues, Bonnie likes to have fun at work and can always be found with a smile on her face, and a desire to get things done well, but to ensure fun along the way.
